

**ARIZONA CARDINALS SEVENTH-ROUND SELECTION
254th OVERALL
OG TREVOR CANFIELD (TC)-CINCINNATI**

On if he wondered whether or not he would actually get drafted:

(TC): “Yeah. It was taking a long time. It doesn’t matter, first round, seventh round, free agent, I’m coming to play ball. It doesn’t matter. I’m happy.”

On what kind of player the Cardinals are getting:

(TC): “They are getting a tough guy that plays with a chip on his shoulder. A mean streak, physical, combative, ‘get after it’ type of player.”

On if he puts up with anything from the defense:

(TC): “No, not one bit.”

On if his mean streak ever works against him:

(TC): “No. It makes the defense focus on me instead of my running back or quarterback.”

On if he met Russ Grimm or any of the other coaches or players:

(TC): “No, not really. They didn’t interview me really at the combine.”

On if he was expecting to become an un-drafted free agent:

(TC): “I was basically thinking that because the Bears called for me and the Bengals. I thought I was going to get picked up by one of them in these last couple of picks, but I am happy that Arizona came through. They put a big smile on my face.”

On if he has ever been out to Arizona:

(TC): “Nope. I know it’s hot. I know they went to a Super Bowl and that we are going back.”

On if this is the first time he will be living away from home:

(TC): “Yes. (My family) is very excited, just like I am. It has been my dream to get drafted. Whoever drafts me is who I am going to play ball for and the world will know that.”

On if he can play anywhere else along the line aside from guard:

(TC): “I play both guards. I have played center. I can snap the ball. I can play anywhere you need me to play. Whatever it takes to make the team. I’ll play quarterback for you. I don’t care.”

On if he played center in any games:

(TC): “Not in games. I was recruited out of high school as a center. When I got to (Cincinnati) I still snapped the ball all the time. I was a center my freshman year, but they made me a guard. I have been working with coach (Jim) McNally after I graduated, and after the Orange Bowl I was working with coach McNally. He worked me out at center.”
