CB GREG TOLER (GT)- ST. PAUL'S COLLEGE (VA)**

On how it feels to be drafted:

(GT): "I feel so blessed and I'm just so happy and honored to be part of this team. I just want to come in and work hard and give it all I got. It's a good feeling. My mom is happy. Everybody over here is happy for me. I'm just happy. I appreciate you guys. I can't explain it. Words can't even explain it. But you will see; the proof is in the pudding. So I have to show you."

On how good he thinks he could be and how far he needs to go to get there:

(GT): "I know there is always room for improvement, but for the most part I am confident, especially when I put on my cleats. I'm not scared of competition. I feel like I have a lot to earn and a lot to gain, but the learning process for the most part, I am not saying it is going to be easy, but I'm about repetition. It doesn't take a lot for me as far as learning things. There is always room for improvement, but I think I could be one of the best to play the game."

On the teams he visited before the draft this year:

(GT): "(I visited) 19. I loved (my visit to Arizona). The coaches showed me around. Steve (Keim), Teryl Austin. We went out to eat. It was hot. I will have to adapt to that because I'm so used to being in the cold up here. I would rather be hot than cold. I met some of the players, they were cool. I just liked the whole environment."

On playing on the same team as CB Dominique Rodgers-Cromartie:

(GT): "It is an honor. Dominique is a great player. I never got a chance to see him play in person, but from what I have seen and heard, people say we play a similar game. People always try to down play a small school because they say you never play against the top talent or they say you are old or you are raw. For the most part, I just want to show you and show people that we are both taking the same route. Hopefully I can come in and do as well as he did or maybe even better. I would just rather play beside him."

On if he will seek out Rodgers-Cromartie and try to pick his brain:

(GT): "Yeah, for the most part, any cornerbacks and defensive backs that I can learn from. I am a sponge and I am going to ask how did they go out in this certain situation or what they think about this or that. So for the most part, yes."

On what it means to him to achieve this after his personal struggles in high school and college:

(GT): "It means a lot to me. Basically, coming out of high school, I was a partial qualifier. My grades, I didn't take as seriously as I should have. But I have been working to get my degree, May 10th from St. Paul's as we speak. To be able to accomplish my dream of playing football, I am just so happy that I can make my mom proud. I just think more so getting my degree and finishing out my football career, hopefully, on a good note."

On what his degree will be in:

(GT): “Criminal Justice.”

On if he is the first St. Paul’s player to be drafted:

(GT): “Yes sir.”

On doing his pro day in the wind and rain at Richmond University:

(GT): “It was cold and windy, but I already knew coming into it from a small school, you can’t tell people I’m not going to work out. That is football weather. So I just had to take it for what it is worth; take it with a grain of salt. Do what I had to do.”

On what he thought about defensive backs coach Teryl Austin:

(GT): “I think he is a good guy. I know he is always going to put things in guy’s hands and be straightforward from what I got from him. I like that because my coach (at St. Paul’s) Kevin Grisby was the same in certain ways. He would tell me what I need to work on or what he thought I needed to capitalize on.”
